According to the accompanying Aston Martin factory build sheet, this DBS Vantage was delivered new in 1969 through the Aston Martin agent Victor Palomo Monegal to its first owner in Alicante, Spain. The car subsequently remained in Spain until 2015, when it was acquired by a discerning collector based in Hamburg, Germany.

The car was then entrusted to a comprehensive restoration programme, addressing both its mechanical and cosmetic condition. The work was undertaken by renowned specialists, including Spraytech and RS Williams, resulting in an Aston Martin of exceptional quality and presentation.

Perhaps the most significant feature of this particular DBS is its original factory left-hand-drive configuration combined with the rare factory ZF five-speed manual gearbox. This was an exceptionally desirable specification when new and is now particularly sought after by knowledgeable Aston Martin collectors. Contemporary records and specialist market information indicate that only a very small number of DBS Vantage cars were produced in this LHD/ZF configuration.

The factory five-speed ZF transmission gives the DBS a particularly engaging driving character, while also making it exceptionally well suited to long-distance European touring. Aston Martin's own historical specification confirms the availability of the ZF five-speed manual transmission on the DBS.

Performance Enhanced by RS Williams

The original six-cylinder engine has been professionally uprated by RS Williams to 4.2-litre specification, providing a significant improvement in performance while retaining the character and engineering integrity of Aston Martin's renowned Tadek Marek-designed straight-six.

The result is a DBS that offers considerably more performance than its original specification while remaining true to the character of the period Aston Martin GT.
